The Momentum Centre is recruiting youth for its meaningful work experience and employment program, for the Momentum Now! Program.

Participant Selection Criteria:

- ✓ Currently in receipt of EIA (Employment & Income Assistance) OR at risk of enrolling on EIA
- ✓ Between 18 and 30 years of age
- ✓ Motivated to work and willingness to learn
- ✓ Ready to move your life forward
- ✓ Demonstrates sobriety management and/or consistent harm reduction
- ✓ Has a solid plan for child care
- ✓ Ready to commit to an 8-month program

Program involves:

- > 8 weeks of pre-employment training where participants stay on EIA
- 24 weeks of paid meaningful work experience in a cooperating workplace that participants help choose in their field of interest and expertise that could lead to ongoing employment. Participants earn \$14.15 an hour for 37.5 hours a week. During the 24-week work experience component participants also receive weekly professional development training.
- At Graduation, participants will have gained 504 hours of highly participatory and hands-on professional development and 636 hours of work experience.
